

JISU WEEKLY REPORT

Joint Implementation Support Unit (JISU) is mandated by the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs and the Chief Justice to coordinate the implementation of the Justice Sector Action Plan 2013-2015. The goal of JISU is to support the effective and smooth implementation of the Action Plan, ensure coherence in reform activities and prevent overlap of reform initiatives and projects. It will support the Justice Institutions in the course of the implementation and planning activities in relation to the justice sector reform.

JISU has recently conducted a workshop of engaging the justice sector stakeholders with the Justice Sector Implementation Plan on 11th August 2014 in Peace Hotel one, Mogadishu. The workshop also raised awareness of the Rule of Law Priorities document and procedures to the key stakeholders.

Participants had a meaningful discussion of the implementation plan as well as the Rule of Law Priorities. The number of people in the workshop was 19 from the key justice institutions including the Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs, the Chief Justice Office, the Attorney General office, the Appeal Court, Bar Association, Civil Society and a member from the Aid Coordination Unit.

This is not the first time that JISU conducted such workshops, but a number of other consultation workshops were held, including consultation about the Justice Sector Reform and Best Practices of Implementation and another consultation on the Terms of References of JISU. Meanwhile JISU plans to carry out other consultation rounds with stakeholders about the Justice Sector Reform Activities.
